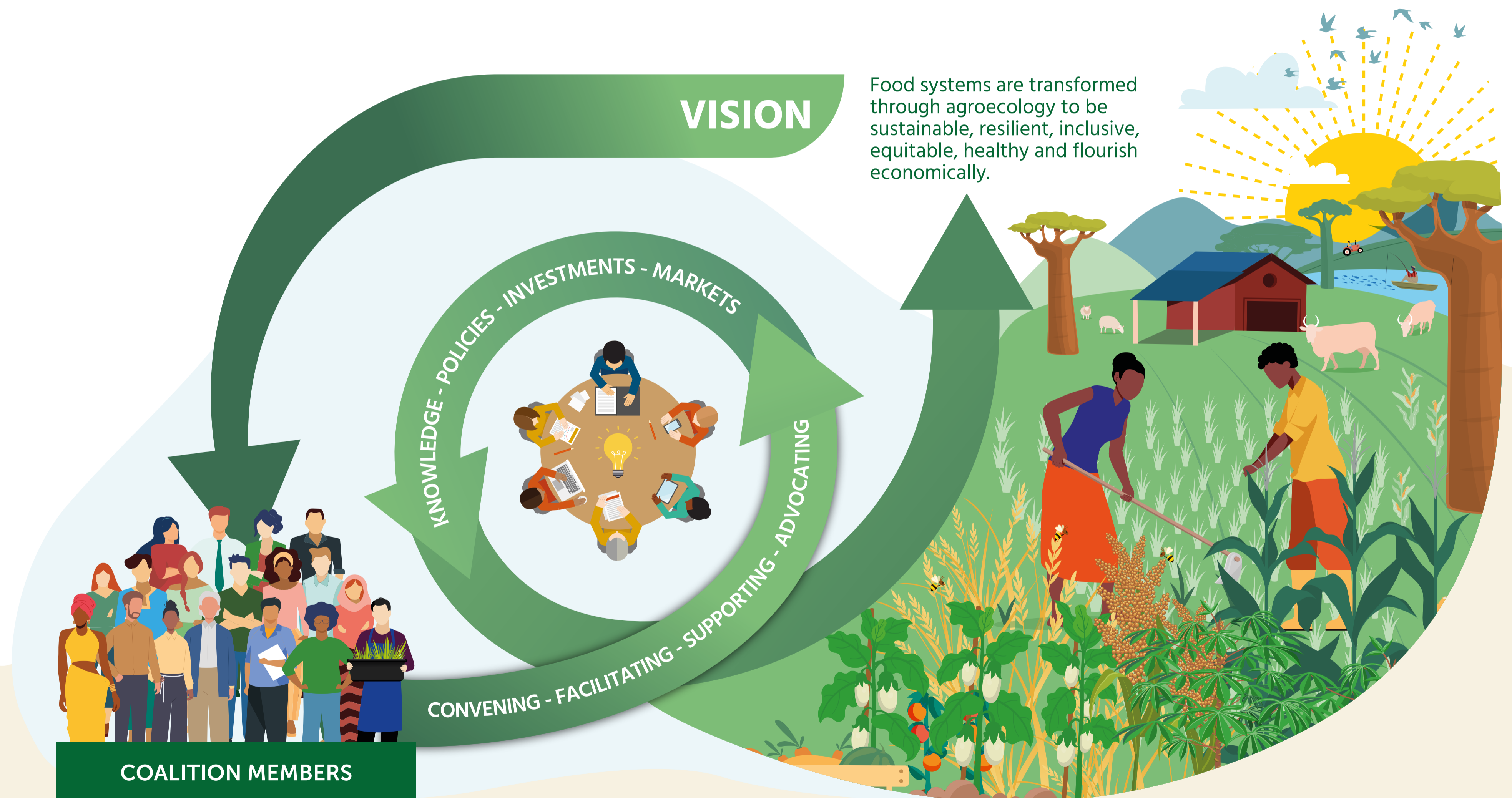

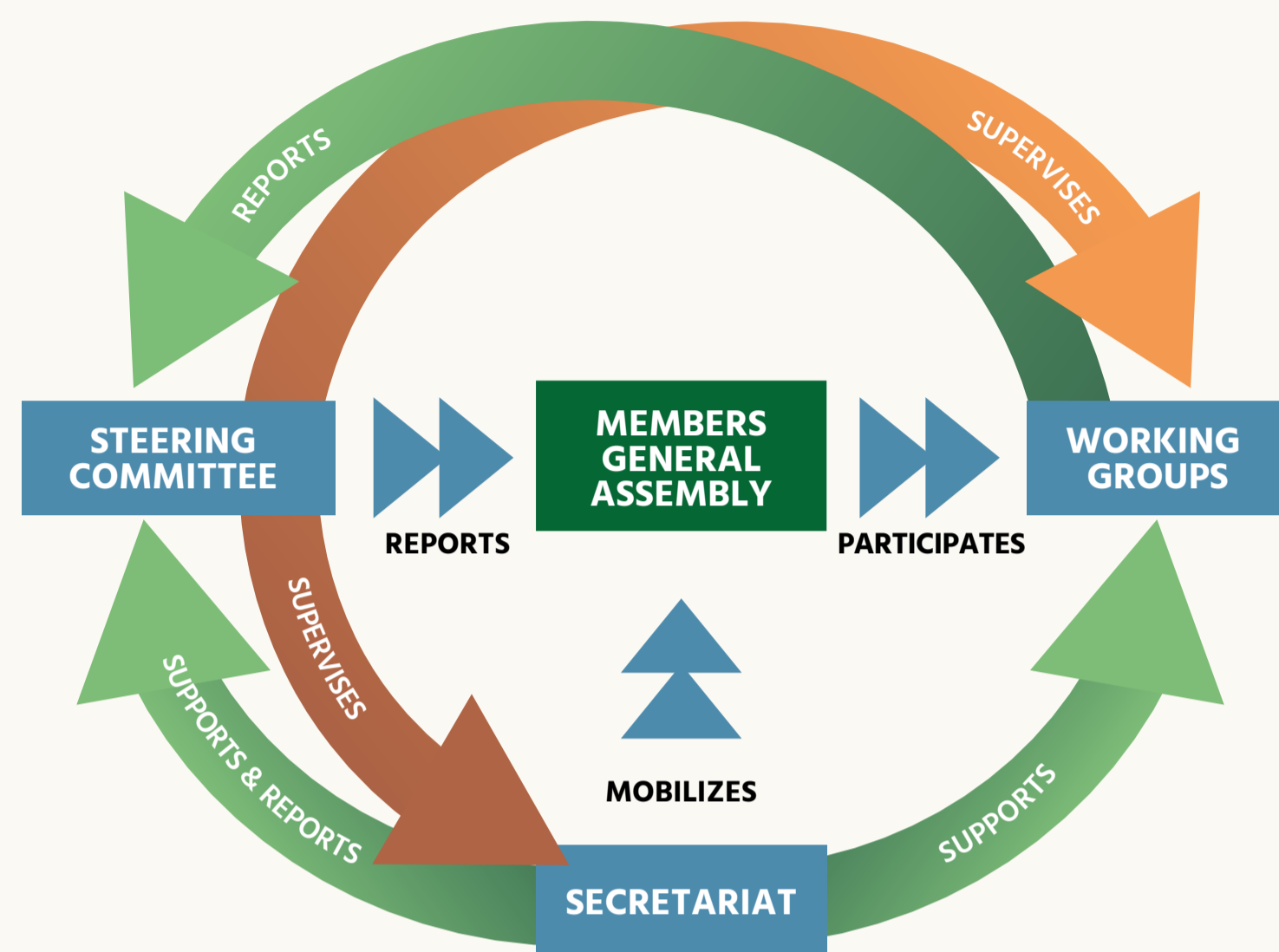
## Our Strategic Objectives
